A professional is:

In the rush to move forward leaders, especially from countries that have not been progressing, tend to use the wrong drivers. Wrong drivers include accountability (vs professionalism), individual teacher quality (vs collegiality), technology (vs pedagogy) and fragmented strategies (vs systems thinking).

Goodhart's Law (Charles Goodhart, 1975)

'England is already at the extreme end of school autonomy and it is unlikely that a further increase in autonomy would drive further school improvement'

Andreas Schleicher (OECD/PISA 2011)

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A partnership is an arrangement in which parties agree to co-operate to advance their mutual interests'

The true Finnish difference is that teachers in Finland may exercise their professional knowledge and judgement both widely and freely in schools. They control curriculum, student assessment, school improvement and community involvement. Much as teachers around the world enter the profession with a mission to build community and transmit culture, Finnish teachers, in contrast to their peers in many countries, have the latitude and power to follow through.
